## **‘Roll Call’ aims to link Houston area women Veterans with state and local resources**

**AUSTIN, TEXAS** – The Texas Veterans Commission Women Veterans Program is proud to announce that they have partnered with local resources in Houston to facilitate “Roll Call: Life Beyond the Oath” Nov. 19-21 at Space Center Houston.

With almost 180,000 women veterans, Texas has the largest population of women Veterans of any state in the nation. Recognizing the need for transition and benefit assistance as well as being a strong advocate for equitable services, the Women Veterans Program is partnering with local community resources in Houston for a Roll Call.

Roll Call will highlight local area women Veteran and family resources regional to Houston as well as provide dynamic workshops such as “Confidence Outside the Uniform,” “Network Your Way to a Career,” “Unclaimed, Unsaid, we Understand” and more.

“Roll Call is designed to let women Veterans know about available services, preserve their histories, connect them to one another, recapture the military's sense of camaraderie and remind the public that more than 2 million women have worn the nation's cloth, proudly serving the red, white and blue,” said Edith Disler, Texas Veterans Commission director of external relations.

Following the premiere event in Houston, additional cities will hold future Roll Call events through 2016, including San Antonio, Waco, Lubbock, El Paso, Denton, Harlingen and Austin.
